

Tenzing is very active and inquisitive. He loves to play with enrichment and his tail and loves to down the slide in his exhibit. He often does somersaults and has been seen doing nine in a row! He spends most of the day up in the custom made 16-foot treehouse made by The Treehouse Masters show. His favorite treats are grapes and apples.

At 16-years-old, Hunter is more shy than Tenzing but can have the attitude of a princess. Guests can tell her apart from Tenzing because she is larger than him and she has a very pale face and lighter colored body. She loves to scent mark over Tenzing's toys, dig up the soil, and graze on grass. She spends most of her day in the custom treehouse made by our Maintenance and Horticulture staff that our staff call the Cupcake Treehouse (because it looks like a cupcake). Her favorite treats are dried fruit and blueberries.

"Learn to blend in when necessary"


