


MEET TONKA'S FRIENDS. THE ALDABRA TORTOISES


QUICK CHUCKLES

ALDABRA TORTOISE

Aldabrachelys gigantea

- SIZE: Can weigh up to 560 lbs. (females average 350 lbs.)
- X AVG. LIFE SPAN: up to 150 years
- MALE BIRTHDAY: January 16, 2015
 - DIET: Grasses, shrubs and small trees, some small invertebrates or carrion
- HABITAT: Scrub forests, coastal dunes, mangrove swamps and grasslands
- LOCATION: Across from Penguin Island
- STATUS THE WILD: Vulnerable

The male is the larger of the two Aldabra tortoises. He can be quite quirky as he likes to stick his whole face in his water bowl and blow bubbles when drinking!
