The mission of San Francisco Zoo & Gardens is to connect people with wildlife, inspire caring for nature and advance conservation action.


# VISITOR INFORMATION

As home to endangered species whose susceptibility to COVID-19 is unknown and to protect young children for whom vaccinations are not yet available, guests are required to follow safety protocols when visiting.

While the State of California has lifted the mandatory mask mandate as of February 15, 2022, SF Zoo requires face coverings indoors and in areas of likely animal contact (all primates and snow leopards). Masks are no longer required outdoors and while riding the Little Puffer steam train.
